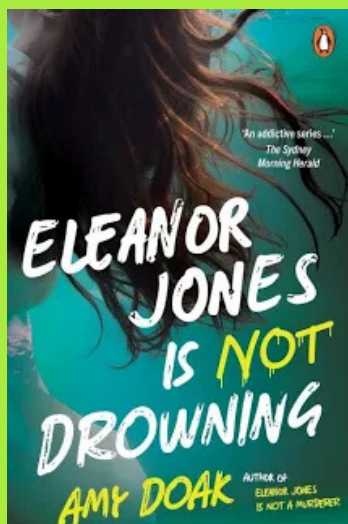




New Secondary Fiction.
